### MINUTES OF THE 2010 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING Held at the Club Rooms on Sunday 30 May 2010 at 11.10am

Robin Barnes welcomed all those present. After establishing that there was a quorum of members in attendance he declared the meeting open.

#### **Confirmation of the Minutes of the AGM 2009**

The minutes for the previous AGM were taken as read.

***Moved Colin Shields, Seconded Viv Haar, "The Minutes of the Annual General Meeting held on 9 August 2009, be confirmed as a true and correct record of the meeting." Carried***

#### **In Coming Correspondence**

- Emails from Tim Hewitt and Caroline Robertson giving apologies and giving some positive feedback on the AGM Annual report which had been circulated. These had been distributed to the outgoing Committee and will be passed to any new committee members.

#### **Out Going Correspondence**

#### **Annual General Meeting Reports**

All Annual General Meeting Reports had been made available to all members for whom the club has current addresses or emails. A copy of the Notice of AGM and all AGM reports had also been posted to the Club's Web Site

## MINUTES OF THE 2010 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING (Cont.)

### President's Report

The report had been available to members prior to the meeting.

Robin commented that a lot of hard work has been put in by committee members doing things to support the club over the last year. This work is not always obvious to others with a lot of time and money going to provide positive input.

After many years of hard work to have the lease issues with Mr Lim tidied up we got a good result in the end. We have altered our insurance and we now work through brokers AON and have managed to get reasonable and realistic levels on both cover and premiums. All members can see the work done on the Clubhouse in recent months. He thanked Viv for the new sign on the front of the building. It was good to note the level of fundraising in the last year.

Robin asked if there were any comments on issues raised in the report. There were none.

***Moved Robin Barnes, Seconded Russell Baxter, "That the President's Report is received." Carried***

### Club Captain's Report

Robin said the report had been distributed prior to the meeting and he would take it as read. He noted that Viv had highlighted the absence of members in the middle tier of the club. We have one or two older rowers, with a big group of young school children. We don't have a viable group of younger adults that the club has had in the past. He also pointed out that we need to recruit some younger people into the administration of the club.

He asked if anyone had any comments to make on the content. There were none.

***Moved Russell Baxter, Seconded Robin Barnes, "That the Club Captain's report is received." Carried***

### Accounts and Balance Sheet

The Annual Accounts to 31 March 2010 had been circulated and members have had ample time to read the document.

Robin pointed out that the \$16,900 shown for insurance expenses on page 2 is misleading. This includes a lump sum payment for premium in advance. The actual annual insurance cost is under \$12,000.

Greg Stothers commenting on the fixed assets listed on pages 4 & 5 advised that the list has been recently updated for insurance purposes and this should go to Lyn Hansen to update the list for the financial statement for the year ended 31 March 2011.

## MINUTES OF THE 2010 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING (Cont.)

Dave Hanley acknowledged Dave Pullar's assistance in recording the receipt of subscriptions and regatta fees. He pointed out that in spite of best intentions to collect all money for training camps and regattas before travel we again had a large amount of outstanding Regatta fees and subscriptions at the end of the season. Greg has been left to carry a lot of this cost. The club can not afford to write off these costs when rowers move on. In the coming season the club will get tough and if you don't pay up front, you won't travel.

Turning to the Statement of financial performance on page 2, Dave Hanley commented that the 'Hires/fundraising' (\$1,260), under revenue is the fundraising by active rowers.

Under expenses on page 2 'Licenses & Registrations' showing \$0 for the year, he pointed out that \$700 had been paid to WRA and \$1,800 to Rowing NZ since 31 March 2010. Under 'Repairs & Maintenance Building' (\$25,541), he pointed out that some additional payments have been made since March 2010 with the total now around \$66,000 (GST Incl.) including expenditure against the \$40,000 (GST Excl.) grant from Pelorus Trust.

Turning to page 3 of the Statement of Financial Position 'Total Current Assets' (\$76,225), Dave Hanley pointed out that the figure is now around \$35,000 after spending on the building post 31 March 2010. The sum of \$5,000 'Bond due to Hotrocks' under the heading Current Liabilities has since been released to the Club following a court decision in the club's favour and this will be used for deck surface repairs.

***Moved Viv Haar, Seconded Russell Baxter, "That the accounts and balance sheet as circulated be received and approved." Carried***

*Parents and Family members of rowers can become financial members of the Club by paying a \$50 Honorary Active Member Subscription. These members have voting rights at the AGM.'*

Robin explained that it had been decided to recommend that the subs for 2010/2011 remain at the same levels as for 2009/2010 because of the economic climate. There was some discussion about the effect of an increase in GST. There being no further discussion, Robin put the motion to the meeting and it was carried.

### **Life Member – Russell Baxter**

'The following motion had been distributed as a notice of motion prior to the meeting:

*Moved Robin Barnes, Seconded Greg Stothers "that the Club appoint Russell Baxter as a Life Member of the Petone Rowing Club"*

Greg speaking to the motion explained that back in 2000 when the Club was in crisis, Greg talked to Russell about getting the Club moving again and they both visited a lot of people with former connections to the club seeking their support. Russell's heart is in the Petone Rowing Club and also in Rowing NZ. He has successfully dealt with and resolved a number of issues and complaints for the club over the years.

Viv spoke in support of the motion and commented that Russell joined the club back in 1970, coming from Wanganui when Viv and others were school rowers. He spent some time as Club Secretary and has held many positions over the years. In the bad old days of import licenses Russell was very successful in opening doors.

## MINUTES OF THE 2010 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING (Cont.)

He is passionate about rowing and was with the club until 1979 when he went to Europe and since he returned in the 1990s. In 1978 when four rowers were selected to row at the world champs Russell arranged sponsorship including regular free flights to Karapiro for training.

Colin Smith explained that the Club had been thin on the ground with only four members when Russell arrived in 1970 and the club then grew. The club had a trip to Australia and Russell was heavily involved in the fundraising for that trip. He was passionate in what he has done for the club. Russell had spent an incredible amount of time on the issue of the lease and clubhouse deck, dealing with the Council and Lim, the tenant from hell and through a lot of patience followed this through to get a good result for the club.

Russell thanked the Club for nominating him as a life member. This is a hell of an honour. The Club is not a building, or plant, or rowers who come and go, the club is all of us. He commented that he was not the best rower but he received encouragement when he arrived at the club. Back then, Colin and others were building boats.

He went on to say that Colin Smith, John Argue, Viv and Greg have all been around since he arrived and were all present at the AGM today. Others like Colin Rofe and Dave Pullar have continued to support the club after their children have rowed out of the club. All of these people and those present today are the club. The people in the club and rowing are an inspiration. He commented that we need to plan to progress with in the system which has been put in place by SPARK and RNZ. He asked members to think about what it takes to motivate rowers to achieve.

He is very pleased to be a member of the club. Today is a huge honour.

The motion was put and carried.

### **Election of Officers**

Robin Barnes advised that the nominations form had been on the Club Notice board for a month and had been removed 24 hours prior to this meeting.

There was only one nomination for each of the offices of the Club. A declaration was made that for the 2010/11 season, Robin Barnes would be President, and Russell Baxter would be Vice President. Greg Stothers would be Club Captain with Owen O'Brien Assistant Club Captain. Dave Pullar would be Honorary Secretary. And David Hanley would be Honorary Treasurer.

Robin advised that there was one nomination for Committee Member, and declared Katie Sadleir elected to the committee for the 2010/11 season. He asked for further nominations for Committee from the floor. After a brief discussion, ***Moved Owen O'Brien, seconded Russell Baxter that Jordon Tohioriki be appointed as committee member for the 2010/11 season. Carried***

Robin explained that it would be good to have other rowers or parents on the committee and asked anyone interested in being co-opted on to the Committee to contact him.

## **MINUTES OF THE 2010 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING (Cont.)**

There was some discussion around the WRA elections. There are five elected and five appointed directors. One director is appointed by each club. Colin Shields pointed out that the appointed Club Director is required to be able to speak with authority and commit the club. He said club nominations must be received by 16 June 2010. Others from the club could stand for election. Colin Rofe advised he could be interested. Agreed nominations should be discussed at the first committee meeting.

### **Building & Plant**

#### **Building**

Robin explained that there were many surprises once the maintenance of the building was underway. Flashings and a lot of the woodwork around the windows had to be replaced. The building is now in a good state. Some additional work is still required on the steel in the canter lever beams. \$7,000 should provide cathodic protection system to stop the salt attacking the steel.

The roof above the restaurant requires refastening and repainting. This is asbestos based and needs to be kept in good repair. The aluminium roof above the gym also needs some work. Russell commented that the aluminium roof is like a pepper pot and has had some temporary repairs in the form of tape applied. This roof needs to be looked at this year. The state of the floor in the boat bay has deteriorated and requires work to make it smooth and safe. We will look at adding all this work to the 1-5 Year maintenance plan.

Colin Smith again raised the idea of putting money aside each year for building maintenance. Russell pointed out that the committee has ring-fenced \$24,000 in a Westpac Account for building maintenance. Robin explained that the deck repairs have already been approved by the Committee using the money held back from Lim.

Russell recommended to the incoming committee that building maintenance items be looked after by a Building Sub Committee, which could meet outside the main committee meeting enabling the main committee to focus on Rowing. The membership of the sub-committee should consist of not just members of the main committee, but also include other members with relevant skills. This recommendation received a favourable response.

Discussion turned to possible future Building development and extensions etc. Colin Rofe commented that this should be looked at as part of the Club's Strategic Plan. Colin Smith pointed out that any plan should take into account the historic tag placed on the building and any limitations that places on what we can do. The building also requires repairs to bring it up to earthquake standards. This would include vertical and lateral bracing.

Robin commented that this is an 80 year old building insured for \$1.77m total replacement cost after a lot of negotiation. Major funding would be required for earthquake strengthening of the building.

## **MINUTES OF THE 2010 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING (Cont.)**

### **Plant**

Colin Smith commented that some plant is getting old, and asked if the club has any plans for maintenance of plant. Robin explained that the incoming committee would prepare a plan for maintenance of plant. Russell commented that day to day ongoing maintenance during the year the condition of equipment is not too bad. Robin pointed out that if equipment is broken or in need of repair the committee needs to be advised so that they can approve and arrange repair.

Owen O'Brien advised that some of the Gymnasium equipment is old and broken and new gym equipment is required. Robin invited the rowers to advise the committee what need repairing and what additional equipment is needed.

***Moved Viv Haar, Seconded Greg Stothers, "That the incoming committee is empowered to purchase a boat, or boats as required in the coming season." Carried***

### **General Business**

#### **Re-imbusement of Expenses**

***Moved, Robin Barnes, Seconded, Russell Baxter, "That the reimbursement of expenses for the President, Club Captain, Treasurer and Secretary as listed in the Current liabilities, in the Statement of Financial Position, on page three of the Petone Rowing Club Annual Accounts, be approved for payment." Carried***

#### **Constitution – School members**

Russell raised the issue that under our constitution, school members don't have the right to vote or hold office in the club. He recognizes the historic reasons for this, but feels at this time we should direct the incoming committee to investigate this aspect, and if necessary propose changes to the next AGM. Viv pointed out that school person members can contribute to the committee and club by being seconded on to the committee.

Debra Adams commented that if you pay subs you should have a right to vote. Greg Stothers gave the background of issues which resulted in this rule. He explained that we value school members and their views are listened to.

Robin explained that the constitution as it stands says school person members do not have a vote. Any change would require a Notice of motion to the next AGM or a Special, meeting called under the rules outlined in the constitution. This requires 10 members to request the Special meeting.

Viv again pointed out that rowers can be seconded to the committee or attend committee meetings and have their say. The committee does listen to what they have to say. Rowers have been co-opted to the committee in the past but didn't continue to take part in meetings for long.

## MINUTES OF THE 2010 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING (Cont.)

The issue of poor communication was raised, and in particular the issue of the actual cost of a regatta being advised two days before the trip. Parents commented that they need at least two weeks notice. Colin Rofe explained that the committee has discussed better communication for this season as well as looking at appointing a manager(s) for crews to ensure better communication with parents.

The comment was made from the floor that the letter of the law says that School Person Members can't vote, and this results in them feeling they are on the back foot. Younger rowers don't feel they are being listened to.

Jordon advised that he would be happy to represent these young rowers and take any concerns they might have with the committee. Owen and Greg could also do this. There was agreement this process may suit some members, however they should all be aware that any member or parent is entitled to attend any committee meeting and raise issues. Many had in the past and the committee is happy to hear their concerns at the beginning of the meeting to enable discussion of their concerns without them having to sit through the administrative parts of the meeting.

Colin shields asked how the current rule stands in law. Robin said this had been checked and it is not illegal.

Robin commented that most of the discussion so far had been by adults. He asked the young people present to say what they want.

The following points were made:

- Want to be heard
- Liked Jordon's idea of him representing them and their concerns at the committee meetings
- Rule change not necessary at this stage – understand the background issues that resulted in the rule
- Don't care about vote – Just want to be heard.

Russell commented that this year is crunch year and those who have not paid subs by the due date will not be able to use club facilities or travel until subs are paid.

Robin asked Debbie Adams, "What are your concerns?" Debbie indicated she would like a vote and opportunities to be heard. She felt the idea put forward by Jordon was good.

Erin-Monique felt that Jordon could end up being the "Meat in the sandwich" She felt that rowers:

- need to be able to feel more comfortable about attending meetings
- want a voice
- want a say on what is going on
- want to be better informed

She went on to say that there are no major concerns at the moment, however during the year there was a rough patch prior to the Nationals. Rowers were given goals to achieve, but felt their hands were tied as they were only allowed to train in certain boats. This made them feel powerless.

## MINUTES OF THE 2010 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING (Cont.)

John Argue suggested that Rowers could email concerns to the committee via Dave Pullar who could add the item to the agenda of the next meeting for discussion.

Viv explained that there had been a discussion prior to the Christmas Training Camp when rowers were advised that Greg Stothers would be coaching Erin-Monique and Jordan Tohiariki would coach the other rowers. At that time he had pulled the plug on sending Learn to Row members to Christmas training Camp as the Club did not have the resources to safely take that many people away Training Camp.

Viv advised that there is a lack of ability for him to get on with Greg. Viv said he likes to win and he has been frustrated about the lack of organisation the get club crews winning boat races. He said his aim is to help people achieve. He commented that the club had appalling results in the last season. Performances were in the bottom 5%. Only Erin-Monique won a medal at Nationals. He said that he did not stand for the committee this year but he hoped more rowers and parents would contribute to the committee this year.

Robin commented that it was pleased to see some of the school person rowers speak up today. He invited any rowers or parents who have concerns to contact him any time of the day.

There being no further discussion, **Robin Barnes moved, Russell Baxter seconded, "that:**

**1.. That the incoming committee be directed to review the Constitution, including sections 5c and 13, with a view to removing any impediments to fullest practicable participation by School Person Members, while retaining the ability of the club to govern and manage itself.**

**2. That official communication channels between the Committee, members and their parents in future be email and the club's web site: [www.PetoneRowingClub.com](http://www.PetoneRowingClub.com).**" Carried

### **Security improvements following recent Break-ins**

Robin advised that there had been a number of break-ins recently. The majority were break-ins to the Jetty Café who had suffered considerable loss. He asked that members be on the look out for suspicious cars and people and write down the details. Bruce Adams asked if we were looking to improve security. Robin explained that the committee is considering options for improved security, including making access to the deck more difficult, motion sensors, Lighting cameras etc.

### **Draft Petone Rowing Club 5 year Plan 2010-2015**

The draft 5 year plan produced by Katie Sadleir had been distributed prior to the annual General meeting with the meeting papers, and members had the opportunity to review the contents prior to the meeting.

Katie explained that this is a discussion document. She commented that some of the proposals outlined in this plan may address some of the issues raised today. She had looked at other rowing plans as a basis for ours and moulded the document to suit this club.

The document includes:

- Our Vision
- Our purpose
- Four Values:
  - Excellence
  - Professionalism
  - Transparency
  - Pride and passion
- Five Key Strategies
  - Performance
  - Participation
  - Coaching
  - Facility/Equipment
  - Governance

For each strategy outcomes and tasks are listed.

Katie explained that following a meeting of some parents and rowers with the committee during the season to discuss some concerns, she had sent an email out to all new parents for whom the club had contact details. This email sought parent help. The club needs support to move forward. This is the beginning of the discussion on this document. The document will be discussed by our new committee over the next couple of months. We would welcome suggestions or offers of support from parents and rowers.

Colin shields commented that it is great to see this document being discussed by the club. The Wellington Rowing Association (WRA) will be considering its strategic map at this year's AGM on the 16<sup>th</sup> of June. It is good to see the club is doing the same. This document has similarities to WRA's plan. Rowing New Zealand also has a Strategic Map.

Colin Smith commented that this is a fantastic document. It makes common sense. It will be good to have it in place. It is good to see Katie on board as a committee member.

The consensus of the meeting was that this is a very good draft document.

### **Rowing World Cup**

Russell reminded those present that the Rowing World Cup is coming up this year. Please attend. Make sure you get there. Colin Shields advised that if anyone is looking for accommodation while attending the World Cup, he has a couple of houses available.

### **Wellington Rowing Association, (WRA) – AGM & and presentation of the Samsung Awards**

Colin Shields reminded those present that the WRA AGM is to be held on Wednesday 16 June 2010, 6.30pm at Sport Wellington, Adelaide Road, Wellington. The guest speaker is Barry Masters, Secretary-General, NZ Olympic Committee.

Robin thanked all those who attended the meeting.

With no further business the meeting was declared closed at 1.20pm

### **PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2010/2011**

Congratulations to all of our rowers who won, placed and competed over this season. The past year has been one of our more successful seasons for some time, with good results in local, regional and national regattas.

The Club's name has also been to the fore in International events, with Axel Dickenson winning one silver and two gold medals in the Under 21 series against the Australian State crews at Penrith, in July 2010. We have two members presently at the National Trials, Axel for the Under 23 Squad, and Alice Wright, for the Juniors. Well done, both of you.

I would also like to welcome Martin Blair and his family to our Club. Martin has a very successful history of coaching young crews in the UK, and we are very pleased to see him working with our Learn to Row and novice groups.

Once again, we have had no adverse comments about our members attending "away" regattas, and we were one of only two clubs to receive a full refund of our bond money for the Nationals in Twizel. All of those attending these regattas should be proud of this, as it reflects well on you personally as well as the Club. This is a continuation of the good work from last year, and a vast improvement on our performance on our last visit to Lake Ruataniwha. Keep it up, it promotes our Club as a responsible and respectable member of the national rowing fraternity, and can only be good for our overall image.

#### **Governance**

We have successfully renegotiated our lease with the Jetty Restaurant, which will now carry through to June 2022. There was no cost to either party in this transaction, as the drafting of the lease was done "in house".

#### **Building**

Following a spate of burglaries targeting the Jetty Restaurant, the Club has had to pay approximately \$2200 for repairs to the glass in the balcony doors. Unfortunately, each break-in had to be treated as an individual claim, which meant that the cost of repair was below the excess level, and the Club had to bear the cost.

## **PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2010/2011 (Cont.)**

As a result of these incidents, we have added a new section of balustrade on the east end of the balcony, as the burglars were using the 200litre waste drum from the Jetty to climb over the wall alongside the stairs. The drum has now been chained to a post, and the waste bins chained to the building to prevent their use as access to the balcony area.

As a separate issue, we had one incidence of what we think was vandalism, where a section of balustrade glass was broken and the cost of repairs less excess was met by our insurers. Security within the building has been improved with the installation of Closed Circuit TV cameras in the restaurant and the entry to the boat shed, and overlooking the length of the balcony. We have accepted a quote for new alarms downstairs, and a new keyless entry system which should be in place shortly. These were a requirement from our insurers who were justifiably concerned with the frequency of break-ins and wanted our security systems upgraded.

### **Plant and Equipment**

We have not acquired any new rowing plant this season, but we have bought a new outboard motor for the coaching boat at a cost of \$3250, including two new coxes' lifejackets. We have also spent a considerable sum on maintenance of our rowing plant, including new sculls, steering stretchers etc, and more money on keeping the boat trailers on the road. These expenses are normal wear and tear, and are covered by the maintenance levy.

### **Finances**

As can be seen from the financial statements, the Club is in good financial health, with funds in reserve to cover any unexpected costs. With this in mind, the Committee have approved a notice of motion to the Annual General Meeting proposing that the Annual Subscriptions remain the same as last year.

On a negative note, we have received notice from our insurers that our premiums for the building, equipment and plant, and loss of income will increase for the forthcoming year by almost 30%, which comes to \$2322, largely due to the costs of the earthquakes in Christchurch. Our excess will now be 5% of the site value which is the aggregate of the three items, (building, plant and equipment, and loss of income) as opposed to 5% of the loss claimed, with a minimum of \$5000 per claim.

We cannot afford to be complacent about our finances, and it is disappointing to see that the Club is still owed \$1425 from the 2008/9 season which we will probably have to write off as a bad debt, but only \$ 565 from last season, most of which is being paid off over time by agreement with the Club. We still have \$3625 owing for this years subs and regatta fees, with a further \$3823.50 still outstanding for the National Champs regatta costs.

### **Membership**

We have 26 active rowers across all of our membership classes, and we are still desperately short in the more senior grades. This does not bode well for the future of the Club, and whilst we can point at the RPC's taking our better athletes, we have to live within the system and maintain a healthy group of members passing through grades, and remaining active within the Club.

Pak'nSave, Petone for their assistance with the cost of food for the Nationals. To all of the parents and other volunteers who assisted throughout the year, your efforts are much appreciated.

To all of the Committee members, who have given freely of their time and expertise to keep the Club running on an even keel. Last, but by no means least, all of our active members for their hard work and determination to win that gave such good results this year. Congratulations to you all.

As I am stepping down from the Presidency, I would like thank all of those who have been so helpful over the past two years, and would ask that you continue to support the incoming President in the same way.
